Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you for your patience and support over the last few weeks, we always knew that changing whole school management systems, which include the parent communications and payment systems, was never going to be an easy task. I apologise to those of you who have been inconvenienced in some way either by the merging of emails by the system in transfer or by the changes to wraparound care and the payments there of. We are confident that as we all become increasingly more familiar with Arbor, the system will prove itself to be worth the initial challenges.

It has been a super busy and exciting time in school, with our Lenten Journey in full swing, a



whole school trip to Eureka, Science week, a music festival and some sporting fixtures for good measure. Once again the children and yourselves have been absolutely amazing, our 'Food Bank Fridays' have been very well supported, so much so that we will need two visits from the Olive Branch to accommodate all of the donations. You will remember that when I wrote the last newsletter the FOSB had

launched a 'Big Fundraiser' to raise money for new blinds in the hall and some of the classrooms. I am pleased to share that through the work of the governors we have now secured funding for that project with a little bit of help from the FOSB we will be having these installed over the Easter break. Please look out for the next FOSB challenge! This means that our Lenten Alms from our themed Fridays will now be shared between CAFOD and Animal Care.

We will soon be entering into our Holy week preparations, these preparations, prayers and assemblies are very important to our faith and are at the heart of our school mission. You are warmly invited to join us for our Holy Week assemblies and our Easter play. Our Easter play takes place in the church and may I please remind you that this is God's house and as such ask you to please remove baseball caps/hats etc. As the Easter play is a solemn story, we would ask that you refrain from taking photographs and videos during the performance. There will be an opportunity for you to take photos at the end.

I would also like to reassure you that the differences in our holiday pattern for this academic year to other schools is an extremely rare occurrence. The governing Body set the term dates and as a Catholic school it is important that we are in school during Holy Week. We are not alone in this, as most other Catholic Lancaster and Morecambe primary schools have also chosen to be in school at this time too. However, we are not insensitive to the





















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difficulties that the difference in holidays has presented to some of our working families because of lack of holiday clubs or those with siblings in other schools, our aim is to always work with you and the governing body are aware of the challenges being faced. We were unable to run an in house holiday club as the cost of running such a club was too high and would have made it inaccessible to most families. We have contacted many external providers to run a holiday club for our holiday dates and sadly, none have been able to help.

Finally, I have to share with you that Lancashire County Council have had to raise the prices of school dinners. A school dinner will now cost £2.90 from the first April. This is as a result of increased staff costs and we will also be increasing our wraparound care costs from the first of April. Breakfast club sessions will now be £3.70 and £3.20 for sibling discounts. Afterschool club sessions will now be £7.75 and £7.25 for sibling discounts.
